★ HOTSPOT ★

Arkaba Station in South Australia's Flinders Ranges is the perfect place to spot the country's native wildlife roaming free in the Outback. The 63,000-acre working sheep station is home to emus, western grey and red kangaroos, euros (a type of wallaroo) and yellow-footed rock wallabies. To conserve indigenous species, sheep have been excluded

from two-thirds of the property to make sanctuary zones.

TIP: Take the Arkaba Walk, a four-day overland hike for small groups, to see the animals day and night; arkabastation.com
